

International Seminar: "Shaking politics: civic-tech for the political sphere" 26 - 30 April 2017 in Oslo, Norway

Co-organised by JEF Europe and Europeisk Ungdom [JEF Norway], the international seminar "Shaking politics" will take place from the 26 - 30 April in Oslo, Norway.

About the Seminar

"Shaking politics: civic-tech for the political sphere" will focus on the use of digital tools in the attempt to turn around the growing disconnection of European youth with politics in general and regional politics in specific. The knowledge about this will be deepened via a panel debate and a discussion.

How will we work?

The methodological approach of the seminar will ensure that the principles of non-formal education are fully respected. This means that the participants will be offered possibilities to be fully engaged in planning and achieving their learning, through various experiential processes (role plays), small group work, expert input and open debates. Related to the inputs provided by external speakers, JEF Europe and JEF Norway will ensure that the speakers who will come to address the participants with their expert input will be very experienced and able to engage youth in active and meaningful dialogue.

Who is eligible to apply: Young people aged 18-30 years who are citizens of one of the 47 member states of the Council of Europe + citizens of Belarus. Applications from non-eligible persons will not be taken into account.

Participation fee: €100 (€50 for locals and anyone who does not need accommodation)

(8 scholarships of 30 EUR will be provided based on the quality of the response with the regard to the applicant's motivation.)

The participation fee covers full board and lodging during the seminar (26 - 30 April). All meals are covered from Wednesday dinner until Sunday lunch. International seminar will start on Wednesday 14:00 and will finish on Sunday 12:00.

Travel reimbursement: 70% of the travel costs (up to max. 150€)

JEF Europe will only issue travel reimbursement by bank transfer and upon presentation of all original travel documents after the end of the seminar.

Do not book your ticket and/or pay the participation fee before you receive an e-mail confirmation regarding your selection. Confirmation emails will be sent by Monday 27 of March 2017.

Cancellation policy: Participants who have been confirmed and have paid their participation fee, but cancel their participation after 3 April 2017 will receive 50% of their participation fee. Cancellations after 12 April 2017 are not refundable at all.

Participation in all sessions is compulsory. In case of absence, JEF may apply a penalty on the travel reimbursement.
